

For the month of December, the Mission Committee sent \$540.00 to Bluffton Self Help to assist in their Holiday giving programs.



Printed below is a thank you letter we received for this donation.

01/13/20

Dear Friends,

Thank you for joining us in our commitment to help Bluffton neighbors in need. Our critical programs rely on community support to put food on the table, keep families safe in their home, obtain employment, learn life skills and become self-sufficient. Together, we can break the cycle of poverty and provide a brighter future for those in need.

Your generous gift of \$540.00 on 12/17/2019 is able to provide hope and support to families like Tim's. Tim, a father of two sons was injured on the job. His company paid workers' compensation, but only at 60% of his pay rate. He has already missed 6 weeks of work and although his job was secure for his return, the doctor had not yet given release-to-work permission. This struggling dad was ready to get back to work, however, the doctor required 3 more weeks of physical therapy and additional evaluation before he could return. The mortgage was due and he could only cover 75% - he did not want to incur late penalities or credit issues. He was very concerned and came to Bluffton Self Help seeking assistance. After an interview and verification of information was submitted, we were able to help Tim and his family. Tim has since returned to shake hands with volunteers and staff members in an expression of gratitude.

Every day, your support makes stories like Time possible. Bluffton Self Help exists in order to help our neighbors, like Tim, in need of food, clothing, educational and financial assistance, and to provide programs that promote self-worth, dignity and create a pathway to personal success. Unfortunately Tim's story is one we hear too often. As the town of Bluffton grows in size, so do the needs among our residents. We have seen an exponential increase in assistance requests. After 31 years of serving our community, we still are true to our late founder, Mrs. Ida's vision to provide a place and a friend for all people in need. Last year, we supported more than 5,000 Bluffton residents and with your support this year we can serve even more. Your contribution helps us achieve the mission of helping our neighbors and working to break the cycle of those living in poverty.






MEN'S BREAKFAST
