

A very short time ago, as I was cleaning out a storage closet, at our house, I came across a box of old photos. Some were from my Grandparents, on my mother's side. My mother was one of nine children. Mom was right in the middle, number five. The whole family spent a great many holidays and celebrations together. Grandpa Pietrangelo always took a family picture. Every year there were changes. Some got married and we added a spouse. Some had children, so our numbers grew. Mom's youngest sisters were still in high school while I was in grade school. Each year the changes were small, nearly significant. But when I arranged them in chronological order, over time the changes were great.

I saw that from 1950 to 1957 my mom was always pregnant and so were many of her sisters and sisters in laws. There were new faces added every year. All the changes were not happy ones. Over the span of years, many put on weight. Some a lot! I saw a lot of hair changes. Not only styles, but some grayer and some a lot less. We lost some uncles, aunts and cousins along the way. Some due to diseases, accidents, divorces and also a suicide.

Throughout our lives there are many changes. Some good and some bad. Many of the changes are our fault. I wish I could say all of my life's decisions were good ones. But that isn't so. I was never in really bad trouble, but I wish I could relive some of the things that I had said and done. I would have, on many occasions acted much differently. I didn't keep all my promises.

Conversely, I am proud of many parts of my past. Some changes are good.

God's world is full of changes. Yet, the God who created this world does not change. The Bible teaches that God is an eternal, timeless, changeless being. Consider the following passages: "God is not a man, that he should lie; neither the son of man, that he should repent: hath he said, and shall he not do it? or hath he spoken, and shall he not make it good?" (Numbers 23:19); "For I am the LORD, I change not; therefore, ye sons of Jacob are not consumed" (Malachi 3:6); "Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights, with whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning" (James 1:17). "Because of the LORD's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail." (Lamentations 3:22). Psalm 102:26-27 states that "They will perish, but you remain; they will all wear out like a garment. You will change them like clothing, and they will pass away, but you are the same, and your years have no end". (Psalm 102: 26-27).

From these passages, we learn the following about God's nature: 1) God is not a man and, therefore, does not change as people often do; 2) God will always keep His promises; 3) God does not lie. Therefore, what God has said will always be true.

In view of these thoughts, there are two important points to consider:

First, since God does not change, then sinners who have not obeyed the Gospel should think about God's unchanging hatred of sin. God loves sinners so much that he sent his son to die on the cross that sinners might have forgiveness. On the other hand, God hates sin! God's hatred of sin will not change, and God's requirements for salvation will not change. God requires that sinners believe in Christ (John 8:24); repent of sins (Acts 17:30); confess faith in Christ (Romans 10:10); and, be baptized for the forgiveness of sins (Acts 22:16). God's requirements for salvation will remain unchanged. On the Day of Judgment, those who have never obeyed the gospel will face God's unchanging hatred of sin. Since God's nature will not change, sinners should change and obey Christ.

Second, for those who are faithful Christians, God's unchanging nature is comforting. Since God does not change, then every promise he has made will be kept. God promises to be with his children in times of trial and temptation (Hebrews 13:5-6); forgive his people when we confess our sins (1 John 1:9); and give eternal life to those who are faithful (1 John 2:25).

On one hand, God's unchanging requirements for forgiveness should prompt all to obey the gospel. On the other hand, God's unchanging promises offer security, hope, and assurance to all those who obey the gospel, live for Christ, and can anticipate a heavenly home for eternity.

Sign-up sheets for some of the items needed for the meals and party will be posted on the sanctuary bulletin board on **October 12.**

Under the direction of their new Director, Family Promise is expanding to reach more homeless families in our area. New opportunities to help are emerging. Are you available to drive families to appointments or spend a few hours with them at the Freedom House in the evening or on the weekend? Volunteer applications for these and other opportunities are now available on the Family Promise website. Training for volunteers will be held on the 4th Saturday of each month (3rd Saturday in November & December) from 10:00-12:00 in their Bluffton office. They also need volunteers in their Bluffton office to help with filing, answering phones, and inventory. A background check is not required to work in the office, and training will be provided.

HISTORY HAPPENINGS



It's October! Time for Jack-o-Lanterns, witches, black cats, trick or treating and all sorts of scary things. So, in the spirit of the season, I want to share with you a St. Luke's story that happened in 1902 and one from a more recent time.

In 1902 a group of young boys were out after dark walking along what is now Highway 170. As they passed St. Luke's they heard strange moaning sounds from the church. A ghost from the church's graveyard? crept a bit closer, the moaning sound stopped. So, they left and again started on their journey home. They were only a few steps on their way when they heard the sound again. A few boys ran as fast as they could away from the church. But others stayed to explore who or what the moaning was coming from. As they rounded the side of the church, the moan got louder. But it didn't really sound like a moan anymore. It sounded like...something like...well, they were not sure what it sounded like. So, they quietly crept toward the noise behind the church. And there was the source of the moan that wasn't really a moan. A cow stood eating grass and mooing softly and happily.

The boys looked at one another and swore not to tell the boys who left that the moaning was really mooing from a cow.

Mary Pickney wrote to me with this story: My dad loved to tell the story of Uncle Joe taking shelter at St. Luke's walking home from a storm late at night and being frightened by a goat he thought was a ghost in the graveyard,

Several years ago, Sadie Graves was alone in the church at night. Suddenly the organ started to play. No one was seated at the organ! No one believed her when she told others about it. But one night the new preacher was alone in the church and the same thing happened to him! I bet people believed when he started telling the story!




